

Dear Friends,

This report starts with some very sad news as I have to inform you that our longest serving Trustee, Mr. Geoff Fuller passed away in late September following a long illness. Many of you will have known Geoff and his late wife over many years as staunch supporters of the *Friends*.

Geoff was renowned as the 'go to person' whenever anyone needed historical information about the *Friends* and will be greatly missed.

On a happier note we have at last found a volunteer to be our Secretary, Sammy Humphries, and she will start with immediate effect. We are delighted to welcome her aboard.

Since our last Newsletter we have held a Summer Garden Party which went very well and we also had a presence at the Fun Day event where we made a reasonable profit. Our next event will be the Christmas Coffee Morning in late November where we hope to see as many of you as can make it.

Work is continuing on the Legacy Leaflet and we hope soon to be able to put it in front of a solicitor for approval on its legality. We have also implemented an investment policy which we will use to maximize the interest we can accrue on donations and legacies.

The 1000 Club, launched mid-year, attracted 67 members and the first three winners have received their prize money. It is to be hoped that next year we can get more members to join the scheme.

- Give or sell our membership information to anyone outside our own charity
- Buy in membership lists from other charities or organisations
- Use external agencies or companies to contact people in order to raise funds for us
- Expect people to pay more than the current membership subscription (£12 at present)

We welcome additional donations, behests in wills, contributions at our fundraising events and the purchase of raffle tickets at such events. However, all additional donations are strictly at the discretion of the donor.

Geoff Fuller 1929-2015

It is with great sadness that we announce the death of Geoff Fuller who died in September 2015. In a long career, Geoff was a chartered naval architect and was also a former Director of British Maritime Technology and sometime Chairman of VSEL (Vickers Shipbuilding and Engineering Ltd) at Barrow in Furness.

We remember him, however, for his great love of animals and for his invaluable contribution to the work of the *Friends* and BCDH. Geoff, along with his late wife Pam, was involved with BCDH from the 1970s: he was also a founding member of the *Friends* and our Chairman from 2001 to 2006. It was typical of Geoff's commitment to the work of the *Friends* that he was still taking an active part in our committee meetings and offering sage advice until a few months before his death.

Geoff was an energetic fundraiser and was one of the main organizers of the hugely successful Christmas Bazaar that used to be held at the Pavilion in Bath in the 1980s. He also ran an impressive Tombola stall for the *Friends*, generously financing the substantial prizes himself. More importantly, Geoff was heavily involved in the redevelopment of the Home which took place around the year 2000. Even before he was Chairman, he was instrumental in discussions that took place with the chosen architects



and in agreeing building plans as well as securing a contractor to carry out the work. Geoff, therefore, played a key role in the fundraising for, and the creation of, the Home that we see today with its smart reception centre and parasol kennels. Although this was a tremendous achievement and the result of hours of dedicated fundraising and committee meetings, Geoff was characteristically modest about his role in bringing the new-look BCDH into being.

Geoff will be sadly missed by all who knew him at the *Friends* and BCDH. A kind and generous gentleman, he was humble and often self-effacing about the immense contribution he made to the work of the *Friends* and BCDH. The Fuller Cattery, the main building of the new cattery, has been named after Geoff and his late wife Pam. It is, we think, a fitting tribute to a family man who had a special fondness for cats and who gave so much of his life to the *Friends* and BCDH.
